Gross and fine motor skill activities.

Gross motor skills are movements related to large muscles such as legs, arms, and trunk. The following activities develop core strength, strength in the shoulder and arm and balance.

Tricycles, Scooters and Pedal Cars
Brushing and sweeping
Hula hooping
Obstacle Courses
Fine motor skills are movements involving smaller muscle groups such as those in the hand and wrist. These activities develop strength and coordination in the lower arm, wrist and fingers
